

EXPERIENTIAL LEARNING

For seniors Jayden Yoder & Paul Yoder, each school day begins with the typical classes like History and English, but as 4th period begins, their educational experience becomes much more active, diverse, and yet also uniquely individualized.

For 45 minutes, their classroom could be anywhere across campus as they work alongside Maintenance Director, Dave Kanagy, learning valuable skills and assisting with projects. At the beginning of the year,

they were tasked with repurposing old cabinets and scrap materials to build tables and storage for the art room. They have helped to assemble new chairs for teachers and structures for the elementary playground. When there is a special event like a banquet or concert, Jayden & Paul are able to assist with set up. Currently, they are building a wooden bench and swing to be sold in the Annual Auction.



As part of the expanding vocational program at

BMS, students are also able to learn by actively engaging in tasks and gaining practical experience through classes like Conservation Science, Tech Ed, and Workplace Skills. Earlier this year, Jayden & Paul were part of the class that built a shooting bench custom

ordered by D&R Firearms. They continue to learn valuable construction skills as they budget for supplies, measure, cut, and help to assemble a 6' x 9' storage shed under the direction of Mr. Jon Farley.

Opportunities to practice welding with a simulator and assist their instructor Rich Yingling with repairing a drone, an electrical fencer, and replacing fluorescent lights with LED light bulbs throughout campus add to their applied-learning experiences.

In addition to elective classes, Jayden & Paul's week also includes 2-3 days of work

release which allows them to spend a few hours in the afternoon gaining valuable experience at a local farm. Jayden, who prefers the outdoors and hands-on work, plans to continue


